MISSION & HISTORY

The Medical Foundation of Nashville empowers the community by supporting health access, promoting healthy lifestyles, championing health and medical education, and cooperating with other charitable entities to work towards a healthier Nashville. Specific activities include public health education, coordinated charity care (Project Access Nashville Specialty Care), and education for physicians and physicians in training.

The Medical Foundation of Nashville was established in 2018, when it was transferred the charitable and educational programs of the Nashville Academy of Medicine, including Project Access Nashville Specialty Care (PANSC), which was established in 2005.



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MISSION MOMENT

The Medical Foundation of Nashville supports health access through the Project Access Nashville Specialty Care Program. Susie's story is just one example of how traditional health access and addressing non-medical, health-related needs are supporting patients.

Susie was referred to PANSC by her specialist's office, when they realized she didn't have insurance. She was referred to the specialist as self-pay by her primary care clinic and was diagnosed through the Tennessee Breast and Cervical Screening Program. As a late 40s mother of two young adults, Susie was terrified of her breast cancer diagnosis. She and her family haven't lived in the US long enough to qualify for TennCare, so PANSC was her only hope. Susie was so relieved when she got the call late on a Friday afternoon that PANSC would cover her care.

Her care coordinators say that Susie quickly replies to any communication and is so very grateful for the care she's received from her volunteer physician specialists and Project Access. Since her enrollment began this past summer, she's had biopsies, surgery, chemotherapy, and physical therapy to support her full recovery, which is still in progress due to the development of lymphedema. Susie was also referred to Gilda's Club and Meals for Health and Healing to provide additional support. PANSC was even able to help Susie get a prosthetic following her single mastectomy, and she's relieved her clothes will still fit the same so she can get as close as possible to feeling like herself, once she's healed a bit more.

Susie plans to visit PANSC to meet the rest of the team who's cared for her very soon. She acknowledges she could have died if she'd not had access to healthcare, but with the help of PANSC and her team of amazing volunteer physician specialists and ancillary services, Susie is starting to return to work and her previous lifestyle. She is so very appreciative of PANSC, her volunteer physician specialists, and all who've helped her to return to her family and her life.



Since 2005, PANSC has operated with a mission to serve our community through providing comprehensive support to patients lacking access to affordable healthcare.



Our team coordinates referrals and guides the patient through each appointment. PANSC patients have a 98% rate of attendance at appointments.

CASE MANAGED CARE

All enrolled patients in PANSC have access to comprehensive case management with our care management team.


