MESSAGE FROM OUR CEO





Bridges to Care Plus

Bridges to Care Plus launched by the Nashville Academy of Medicine and the Safety Net Consortium of Middle Tennessee to address disparities in access to specialty care for the uninsured.

Project Access Nashville Specialty Care

Bridges to Care Plus rebranded as Project Access Nashville Specialty Care to align with statewide and national access to care programs utilizing the same care coordination model.

The Project Access program celebrated 10 years of serving the Nashville area in addressing access to specialty care alongside community partners.



MISSION MOMENT



While MFN and PANSC serve many patients, Julia is special to our team because of the interactions she's had with her care navigator. Julia works to support herself, which has been a struggle. Finally in April, she was diagnosed with sleep apnea, but with the diagnosis came a prescription for an expensive machine to improve her breathing while she sleeps. Given her low income, she didn't have the money to purchase the machine, which was supposed to improve her overall health. Once Julia shared with her care coordinator that the nurse at her volunteer specialist's office had searched for a discount, but even then, she didn't have the \$600 needed to purchase the machine she needed, the Project Access Nashville team went to work. The PANSC team reached out to an organization that collects new and used donated machines for redistribution. They had just the machine Julia needed available for donation, but the shipping would need to be paid, and the machine requires an SD card to function properly.

Thanks to funds dedicated to supporting the social determinants of health of patients, PANSC was able to pay for the shipping and purchase the SD card, as even that amount was still unaffordable for Julia. It's been a few weeks since Julia started using her machine, and she reports that it has taken some getting used to, but she's seeing the benefits and feeling much better as a result of using it. She was so surprised and happy that PANSC could find a donated machine and provide the funds to have it shipped and properly working to help her. Julia is just one patient, but there are so many more who have the opportunity to pursue healing because of the work PANSC is able to do with the support of our amazing donors.




